*We believe the God fire burning in our hearts can transform both ourselves and our world.
We believe we are called by God to a deep personal relationship with Jesus, the lover of all creation, as brother.
We believe we are called to be good news people.
We believe we are called to be stewards of creation.
We believe we are called to keep our hearts and minds open and attentive to God's will.
We believe we are called to witness by prophetic action to our option to the poor, the oppressed, and people at the margins.
We believe we are called to immerse ourselves in the culture in which we live and work.
We believe in community which is prayerful, inclusive and welcoming.
We believe our international brotherhood and sisterhood is a witness to a search for global unity.
We believe it is in facing our own fragility that we can accompany others in theirs.
We believe that by sharing Eucharist and reconciliation that we are drawn beyond ourselves to the mystery of God.
We believe others share the charism of Edmund, and are one with us in living it out.
We hear the call to live justly, love tenderly and to walk humbly with our God.*

Jesus and Edmund Rice gave us the model for Servant-Leadership, and we are the ones who have to take up the mantle and carry out this radical Ministry. As Knights, it is what makes us different, and it is what we are called to do. We are not perfect, and there are many ways that we can improve, but there is no doubt in my mind that we are "Edmund's People", and in 2022-23, I believe that we lived the Creed.

As a ministry of the Catholic Church, we are guided by the gospel values of faith, hope, and charity. We challenge our students to preach the good news of the gospels always, and to use their words only when necessary.

In 2022-2023, we achieved many successes inspired by the innovation of our faculty and staff, the accomplishments of our students, and the collaboration of the entire STMC community. The following offer only a few highlights that reflect the aspirations communicated in our strategic plan, “Looking Forward 2021-2025”.

1. **Servant Leadership:** With the help and support of a global network of Edmund Rice colleagues, we have been able to have more direct involvement with a variety of Edmund Rice Education Beyond Borders (EREBB) and Edmund Rice International (ERI) initiatives. These opportunities have enabled us to begin shifting from a model of service and charity towards one of action and true advocacy.
2. **Excellence and Innovation in Teaching & Learning:** Our Teaching & Learning Team is exceptional and highly regarded as industry leaders across the province. A good number of schools mirrored the manner in which this team prepared and supported our faculty to implement Ministry mandated changes to assessment reporting.
3. **An Inclusive & Engaged Community of Faith:** Created in the spring of 2023, our new Mission Integration Committee (MIC) will be tasked with enhancing the school community’s understanding of an Edmund Rice Christian Brother Catholic Education and assist in the expression of the charism of Blessed Edmund and the gospel values in all aspects of school life.
4. **Exceptional People, Leaders & Teams:** The STMC Ltd. and Foundation Boards, Staff, Parent Association, and Alumni Association each created opportunities to reflect on their development and build capacity to contribute to STMC’s aspirations. The ability to recruit, retain, and empower staff and volunteers with a diversity of strengths is evidence of STMC’s development of Exceptional People, Leaders, and Teams.
5. **Stewardship of Resources:** Stewarding our financial assets is mission-critical. Attending to the shorter-term cash-flow needs of the STMC Ltd. Board, while at the same time meeting the longer-term investment requirements of the STMC Foundation takes nuanced and well researched investment strategies. In the spring of 2023, STMC embarked on a journey when it announced that Odium Brown had been entrusted with the assets of both of our boards.

A huge personal note of gratitude to the STMC Ltd. Board for their faith and support of the work that we are doing, and to the entire STMC community for their ongoing commitment to advancing the mission, vision, and values that make STMC so special.

2022-2023 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2022-23, our amazing staff, families, and volunteers continue to provide our students with myriad opportunities to grow and excel in the areas of Athletics, Academics, Advocacy & Action, Arts, and Student Life, all while also integrating Faith development and a deep commitment to the service of others.

Highlights

• Academic Achievements

STMC is currently ranked in the TOP 10% of all BC Secondary Schools based on academic performance with the Fraser Institute giving STMC a rating of 8.3, ranking the school 23rd of 252 schools. Over 60% of our grads earned some type of scholarship. The total value of scholarships earned by our graduates was in excess of \$700,000.

• Scholarships and Bursaries

The 2022-23 Grads were offered in excess of \$700,000 in scholarships/ bursaries. One of our 2023 Graduates, Brandon DeLazzari was one of 50 recipients nationally of the highly prestigious Schulich Leader Scholarship (value = \$100,000 over 4 years). An equally important piece of information to note is that over 65% of our 2023 graduates in this past year's Grad Class were awarded some type of scholarship/ bursary to attend school this fall.

• Standards Based Assessment

STMC teachers fully and successfully implemented Standards Based Assessment (SBA) / proficiency scale assessment in all of our Junior grades. The intense focus on the area of SBA for almost all staff has contributed to inventive assessment practices and more learner-centered assessments in many classes.

• Requests for Enrollment

Request for enrollment once again exceeded the school capacity; STMC accepted 710 students, including 3 international students.

• Service to Others

Ben Johnston, our Head of Advocacy and Action has assembled a team of students who are committed to moving our community from charity to action and from service to advocacy. There are many initiatives at STMC including JEDI (Justice Equity Diversity and Inclusion), Female Safe Space, Truth & Reconciliation, Action to Advocacy workshops, as well as through immersion trips such as ACTION in Kearney, NJ, Pilgrims in Peru immersion, Guadalupe Middle School immersion in Brownsville, TX.

• Home of Champions

Gr. 8 Boys Basketball, Sr. Boys Rugby 7s AA, track & Field Junior Boys & Girls, Senior Boys & Girls, & Team Aggregate Gr. 8 Volleyball AA, and Sr. Volleyball. Fraser North Zone Championships: Aquatic Girls AA, Jr. Girls Basketball AA, Sr. Girls Basketball AA, Sr. Boys Basketball AA, Golf AA, Sr. Boys Rugby 7s AA, Sr. Ultimate AA, Gr. 8 Volleyball AA, Sr. Volleyball AA, Girls Wrestling, Track & Field Gr. 8 Boys, Jr. & Sr. Boys & Girls, Overall Boys, Overall Girls, and Sr. Aggregate. Provincial Championships: Gr. 8 Football & Sr. Ultimate AA.

• The House System & Advisory

The STMC House System continues to flourish as we intentionally instill the Mission to Learn. Lead. Serve.

• Course Offerings

We offered a total of 97 different courses to students in Grades 8-12. We also continued to grow our engineering program by offering Technology Explorations 10. This new grade 10 focuses on foundational skills that equips students to pursue engineering or programming the following year.

• Learning Resources Centre

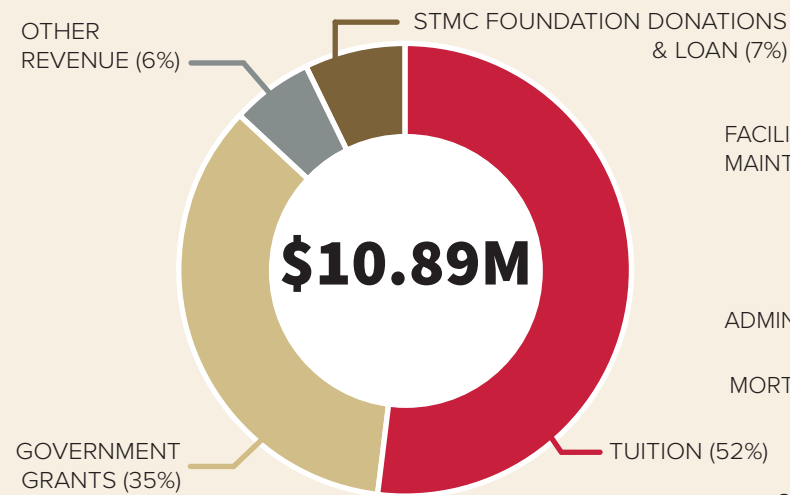
STMC employed 14 full and part-time staff in our Learning Assistance Centre (12 Educational Aides and 2 Learning Assistance teachers) who provided support and service to over 73 low and high incidence students and their families. All students with a diagnosed learning challenge received an updated Individual Education Plan (IEP) outlining the specific academic or behavioural adaptations or modifications required in order to support that individual student.

Our High Incidence students continued working on their specialized and tailored/individualized education programs (IEPs) designed by our Learning Assistance teachers and supported by our Educational Assistants. Our MoE designated Low Incidence students as well as those students without a formal IEP, but who receive support through our Learning Resource Centre were scheduled into classes and supported directly by their classroom teachers and by the LRC Team.

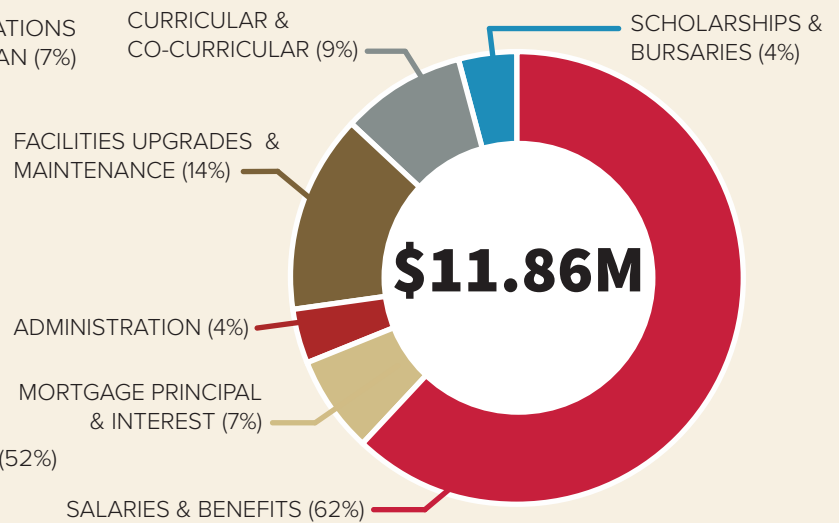

REVENUE

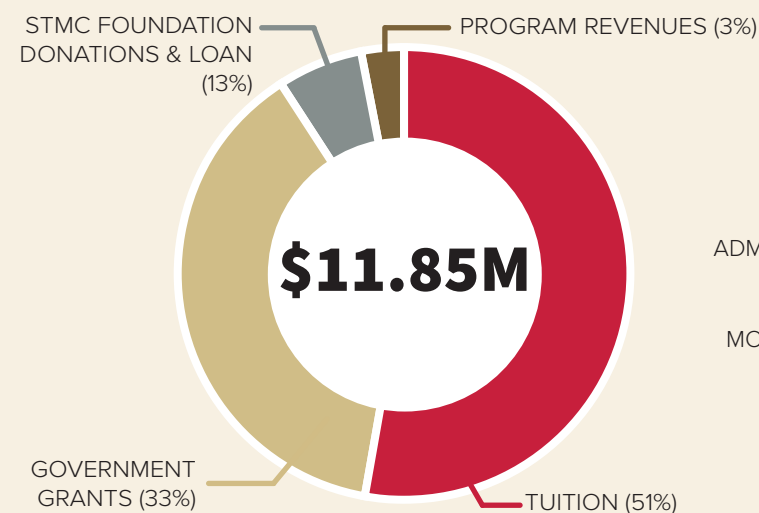


EXPENSES

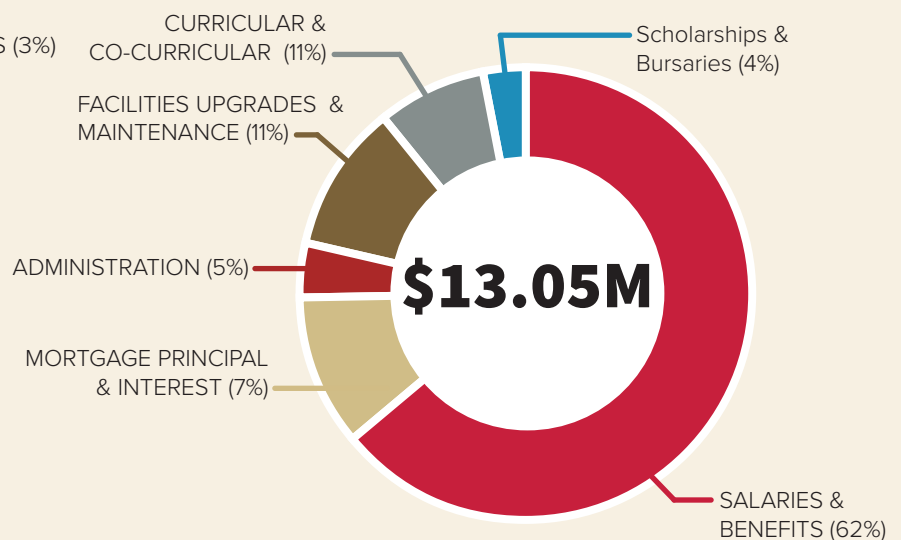


2023-2024 BUDGET

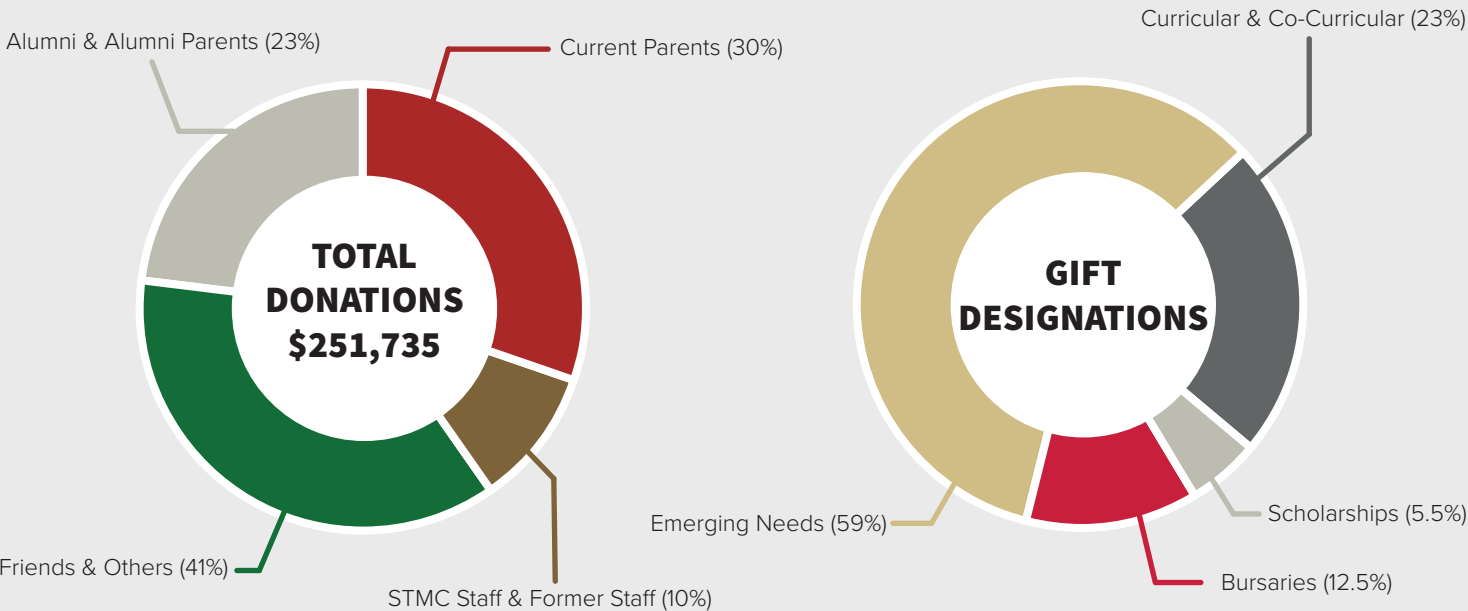
